**WISCONSIN FAMILY ACTION LAUNCHES RADIO ADS EXPOSING  
OUT-OF-STATE CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS**

*Assembly candidates accepting significant contributions from out of state donors with pro-homosexual agenda*

MADISON— On Wednesday, Wisconsin Family Action (WCA) announced its radio ad campaign exposing significant out-of-state campaign contributions from homosexual activist donors with motives to push a pro-homosexual agenda. The radio launch targets three assembly seats which have received large sums of special interest donations that could have significant impacts on the outcome of these seats.

“When half of a candidate’s donations are coming from San Francisco, Massachusetts or Denver and the donors are strong gay rights activists, Wisconsin voters have the right to know the real values behind a candidate and question that candidate,” said Julaine K. Appling, president of Wisconsin Family Action.

The three seats with the most out-of-state, pro-homosexual special interest donations are from the [57<sup>th</sup>](#) (City of Appleton), [68<sup>th</sup>](#) (Eau Claire), and [96<sup>th</sup>](#) (Crawford and Vernon Counties) assembly districts in which nearly \$24,500 has been given through a “virtual conduit” of out-of-state donors driven by homosexual millionaire and Quark founder Tim Gill, from Colorado.

An [Atlantic Monthly](#) article last year highlighted the strategy by gay multi-millionaires targeting state and local races that will significantly further a pro-homosexual agenda in the states.

“Voters need to know that these candidates are funded by out-of-state, gay rights activists attempting to legalize gay marriage and undermine the nearly 60% of Wisconsin voters who voted for the Marriage Amendment in 2006,” said Appling. “It is absolutely alarming that candidates’ personal agendas and interests are undermining the citizens of these districts. It’s amazing that these candidates more highly regard special interest money than the fundamental values of those they are seeking to serve.”
